CeMEAS facilitates multi-regional and multi-disciplinary research by combining expertise from various disciplines and the area studies.

One of CeMEAS' core projects representing this approach is CETREN, an institutional framework that brings together expertise on East Asia and India. CETREN's central theme is the »Politics of the New«. Scholars from the humanities and social sciences conduct in this network research on the most enduring topics of modernity, such as the relation between religion and secularity.

In cooperation with the Department of East Asian Studies CeMEAS also hosts the »Göttingen Lecture Series on Modern East Asia«. It provides a forum for scholars to discuss and present important issues and ongoing research projects.
